


Cooperation actions: How to bring down barriers to build sustainable partnerships among EU IJG Goal Managing Authorities

In a time when regional challenges extend beyond borders, the need for joint efforts is more pressing than ever. Traditionally, there has been a desire for better synergy and cooperation between regions and funding programmes, but turning these plans into real results has often been a tough challenge. The programming period from 2021 to 2027 has highlighted this goal, requiring member states to include cooperation actions in each specific objective, thus expanding the range of required collaboration (Reg. EU No. 2021/1060 Art. 22 3 d) vi).

However, the implementation of cooperation actions projects requires a lot of partnership effort and also knowledge and exchange of good practices in the EU context. Oftentimes stakeholders are locked on the partnership they currently operate and lack possibilities to exchange with others, which might become the missing key for the success of their cooperation action.

We are reuniting to present and discuss different ways how to bring down barriers to build sustainable partnerships with cooperation actions. It is a complex and multi-level topic, so it is important to spend some time discussing your persisting barriers and share practical solutions to overcome them. It is particularly important as programmes are now briskly stepping into the implementation of the current programming period.

During this two-day workshop, we will share practical capitalisation and communication tools and techniques, with a particular focus on setting up mechanisms for cooperation action support, discussing practical challenges related to cooperation action planning, implementation and partner identification.

Objectives

This workshop aims to facilitate the exchange of knowledge and foster collaboration among programme officers managing Investment for Jobs and Growth programmes, specifically those responsible for coordinating cooperation actions and having their role in embedding cooperation.

Through these dynamic sessions, we aim to address common challenges, encourage you to make the most of Interest's tools supporting the cooperation actions - Interactive map tool, coaching and expert assistance, Guidelines on cooperation actions and publication on current good practices in the field. It will also serve as a basis for further coordination and harmonisation of the approach to cooperation actions, and as a good occasion to meet your future partner.

The event is intended towards Managing Authorities of national or regional programmes of the Investment for Jobs and Growth goal with the intention to start building-up active cooperation action partnerships in 2024 and 2025, and proceed with their implementation in 2025.
