

The programming period 2021 - 2027 has brought new challenges and opportunities for regions to extend beyond borders, reflecting the contemporary pressing needs for better synergy and cooperation between regions and funding programmes. This is reflected as well in the Investments for Jobs and Growth goal, requiring member states to include cooperation actions in each specific objective, thus expanding the range of required collaboration (Reg. EU No. 2021/1060 Art. 22 3 d) vi).

Traditionally, there has been a desire for cooperation beyond borders, but at the same time turning such ideas into real results has never been an easy path. The implementation of cooperation actions projects requires a lot of partnership effort, but also knowledge and exchange of good practices in the EU context. Oftentimes stakeholders are locked on the partnership they currently operate and lack possibilities to exchange with others, which might become the missing key for the success of their cooperation actions.

Objectives

We are reuniting to present and discuss which are the main ingredients for the successful cooperation actions recipe. It is a complex and multi-level topic, so it is important to spend some time discussing the persisting barriers and share practical solutions to overcome them. It is also important to share good practices of programmes which have already launched their cooperation actions.

During this two-day workshop, we will share practical capitalisation and communication tools and techniques, with a particular focus on setting up mechanisms for cooperation action support, discussing practical challenges related to cooperation action planning, implementation and partner identification.



Point of meeting: Markt 11, 6811 CG, Arnhem, the Netherlands



Travel

Train station Arnhem Centraal (Central) is easily accessible with a direct connection to and from the train station of Amsterdam Schiphol Airport. There are two options to get from train station Arnhem Centraal to the House of the Province, via public transport (bus) and on foot (approx. 15 min walk).

The House of Province is accessible via bus on multiple different lines, bus stop 'Eusebiuskerk' is closer to the House of Province, but has less connections from the train station.

- Bus 12 (towards IJsseloord 2), exit at busstop Eusebiuskerk
- Bus 43 (towards Apeldoorn Station via Dieren), exit at bus stop Eusebiuskerk
- Bus 2 (towards De Laar West via Kronenburg), exit at bus stop Airborneplein
- Bus 3 (towards Het Duifje), exit at busstop Airborneplein

The House of Province is also easily accessible on foot. It is possible to walk through the centre of Arnhem or around it, both walks are between 15 and 20 minutes. The walk through the centre follows this route: Stationsplein – Willemsplein – Jansstraat – Grote Oord – Weverstraat – Broerenstraat – Turfstraat – Markt. Around the centre it follows: Stationsplein – Nieuwe Plein – Oeverstraat – Kleine Oord – Turfstraat – Markt. For up-to-date information about the route enter the address "Markt 11" in any map application and select walking.

Accommodation

For your stay in Arnhem we recommend one of these hotels:

Bastion Hotel Arnhem

Address: Eusebiusplein 1A, 6811 HE, Arnhem, the Netherlands

The Bastion hotel is located right next to the House of Province which makes the location ideal for your visit to Arnhem. The hotel is easily accessible with the same options that apply to the House of Province itself, explained above.

Hotel Haarhuis

Address: Stationsplein 1, 6811 KG, Arnhem, the Netherlands

Hotel Haarhuis is located opposite the train station Arnhem Centraal (Central). This makes the location of Hotel Haarhuis ideal with the arrival and departure of the visit to Arnhem, because there is close to no travel time to and from the train station. The location requires a small walk in the morning to get to the House of Province.

Holiday Inn Express Arnhem

Address: Nieuwe Oeverstraat 50, 6811 JB, Arnhem, the Netherlands

Holiday Inn Express is located in the center of Arnhem almost exactly in between the train station and House of Province. The hotel is accessible by foot from the train station. The walk from the hotel to the House of Province is 5 minutes.
