






Interregional Cooperation Projects

- After three calls







Recommendations:

- Programmes for innovation require **financial management flexibility** to offer easy access for companies
- Mobilise your innovation ecosystem actors, especially your clusters as facilitators to prepare SMEs to access finance, prioritise cascade funding and engage in interregional cooperation

Using ERDF for Innovation Express Calls (IEC)

IECs published in 2021 & 2024

- Within the framework of Interreg B (DRP & ASP)
- On the topics of digitalisation, healthcare & circular bioeconomy
- Using existing funding programmes for R&D&I

Support regional stakeholders

- Using exception (grants instead of loans) as incentive
- Close relationship with potential beneficiaries
- "What if the relevant funding scheme does not fit?"


- Participation in the 2nd call of VInnovate
