
Context of b-solutions







Association of European Border Regions (AEBR)



- Highlight the role of European border regions in the political landscape;
- Represent their common interests;
- Enhance cooperation between border regions throughout Europe;
- Promote exchanges of experiences, information and solutions to common obstacles.







Origin of b-solutions

Interreg, the financing instrument, has had an enormous impact on CBC in Europe but there was a need for further analysis of cross border obstacles.












Goal of b-solutions

- Promoted by the European Commission's DG REGIO and managed by AEBR since 2018.
- The b-solutions initiative intends to identify and promote sustainable methods of resolving legal and administrative obstacles that hinder cross-border cooperation.
- Along EU internal land and maritime borders as well as EU-EFTA and EU-IPA borders.









What does b-solutions offer

- **Objective 1**: **legal support** through expert analysis of legal and administrative cross-border obstacles and their solutions.
 - * The call for new b-solutions cases is open until 27 February 2026.
- Objective 2: additional support to advance the solution as a follow-up to objective 1.
- Objective 3: sub-grants to develop chosen solutions via pilot actions as a follow-up to objective 1.








Objective 1: call for new cases









Call for new cases

Goal: Support 60 cases resolving border obstacles of a **legal** and/or

administrative nature

Target: **Public bodies in border regions** (including public equivalent bodies);

and cross-border structures (Euroregions, European Groupings of

Territorial Cooperation -EGTCs)

Scope: Border regions along EU internal land and maritime borders and

along EU borders with EFTA and IPA countries

Themes: Institutional cooperation, Public services, Labour markets and education and European Green Deal







Which kind of border obstacles do we look at?

Legal and **administrative** obstacles which arise because of:

- lack of coherence of legislation applicable on the different sides of the border
- inconsistencies, non-existence, or overlapping of **different** administrative procedures
- applicable European, national or regional legislation or administrative procedures do not take into account the specificity of cross-border interaction









What do participants obtain from b-solutions?

- We match the case applicant with a legal expert
- The expert conducts a legal analysis of the obstacle and makes a visit on site
- The expert writes a **report**, including a **detailed description of the specific obstacle** faced, and **proposals for concrete solutions**
- Participation in a compendium illustrating a variety of obstacles and possible solutions to enhance cross-border cooperation







What do participants obtain from b-solutions?



Support to:

- Evidence: Demonstrate the cross-border obstacles they face
- **Progress**: Move towards solutions
- Capacity building: Raise awareness of cross-border cooperation
- Knowledge: Be part of a European project to bring European integration forward









Examples of cases selected







CICERO – Croatia Italy Civil Protection collaboration

Advised entity: Unione dei comuni pratiarcati – IT-HR

Obstacle:

The Union of Pratiarcati Municipalities (Veneto, Italy) and the municipality of Labin, Croatia, aim to collaborate on civil protection through the Interreg CICERO project. Within the project an analyses of the legal and administrative framework in case of natural disaster and identification of obstacles has been conducted.

- Legal barriers prevent local civil protection groups from cross-border interventions.
 - Joint interventions can only be carried out within the framework of the European Civil Protection Mechanism, which is activated at the Member State level rather than the regional or even municipal level.
 - The timing and procedures for obtaining permits are often long and complex due to bureaucracy.








CICERO – Croatia Italy Civil Protection collaboration

The *b-solutions* report further investigated the identified legal and administrative obstacles and proposed possible solutions.

Proposed solution:

• Definition of an agreement for joint intervention after the example of the Interreg project *Crossit-safer* at the Slovenian – Italian border.











Shared cross-border public services: French-German crèches

Advised entity: Eurodistrict SaarMoselle EGTC – DE-FR

Obstacle:

The Eurodistrict SaarMoselle EGTC is partner of an Interreg project co-financing the development and construction of two cross-border crèches (nurseries) – one in Germany and one in France.

- The obstacles identified are multiple and lie within the **diverging national legal frameworks** in the field of:
 - Co-financing of running costs;
 - tax implications (property tax, VAT);
 - staff qualifications;
 - safety rules, as different standards apply.









Shared cross-border public services: French-German crèches

Examples of proposed solutions:

- Introduction of a special regime for cross-border institutions regarding the payment of the French operating aid to crèches to the crèche in Saarbrücken.
- VAT exemption for the French partner on the basis of the Franco-German Treaty of Aachen.
- Consultation with local medical/public health authorities on the differences about childhood vaccination to discuss whether the co-existence of both regulations is possible.
- Cooperation with the local fire department is considered essential and it is suggested that the local standards on fire protection be applied.







Other examples of 7 years of b-solutions

Outputs: 6 calls for proposals since 2018 leading to 165 cases showcased in:

- 4 compendiums of reports
- 3 thematic booklets
- 2 illustrated storytelling booklets






















Lessons learnt after 7 years of b-solutions

Solutions to border obstacles of legal and administrative nature:

- Must be tailored to the specific legal, social and economic framework of the territory;
- Should be supported by political leaders willing to implement the measures necessary to remove or at least reduce these obstacles;
- Depending on the scope of the obstacle, could engage authorities at the national level in the countries involved;
- Can include multiple stages and types of solutions, from amending or creating new legal frameworks to enabling the operational set-up of the final solution.









How do Interreg and bsolutions complement each other?







What b-solutions can offer to the NCPs

• *b-solutions* increases the effectiveness of Interreg:

providing expert support **analysis** to follow up on the implementation of Interreg projects that stalled because of legal and/or administrative obstacles

• *b-solutions* expands the potential of Interreg:

offering a first step towards approaching legal and administrative obstacles to crossborder cooperation which can be developed as Interreg projects under ISO 1

• b-solutions supports regional development and promotes cooperation:

removing 1/5 of border obstacles could lead to GDP +2% in border regions and 1 million new jobs and promoting European integration

Required information in the application

- Title of the case to be advised
- Information on the applicant and co-applicants if any
- Thematic of the advised case
- Criteria 1: Description of the obstacle
- Criteria 2: Potential increase in cross-border cooperation
- Criteria 3: Applicant or co-applicant's mandate to devise solutions
- Criteria 4: Replicability
 - Information on the border area that is subject of the application
 - Possibility to upload documents in support of the application
