Data governance in 21-27 period

...10 years later



Open data is **EU law**
incorporated in **CPR**.

Data governance requirements

E-Cohesion system

CPR Art. 69(8) (and Annex XIV): "Member States shall ensure that all exchanges of information between beneficiaries and the programme authorities are carried out by means of electronic data exchange systems."

Monitoring system

CPR Art. 72(1) (and Annex XVII): "The managing authority shall [...] (e) record and store electronically the data on each operation necessary for monitoring, evaluation, financial management, verifications and audits in accordance with Annex XVII, and ensure the security, integrity and confidentiality of data and the authentication of users."

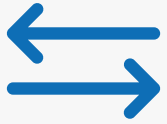
Data transmission

CPR Art. 42 (and Annex VII): "The Member State or the managing authority shall electronically transmit to the Commission cumulative data for each programme [...]"

List of operations

CPR Art. 49(3): "The managing authority shall make the list of operations selected for support by the Funds publicly available on the website [...]. The list shall contain the following data: [...]" (4) in open, machine-readable form

Data collection at EU level

SFC portal

CPR Art. 69(9) and Annex XV: " Member States shall ensure that all official exchanges of information with the Commission are carried out by means of an electronic data exchange system" - SFC2021
-> Automatic data transfer via API is possible, but not used by many

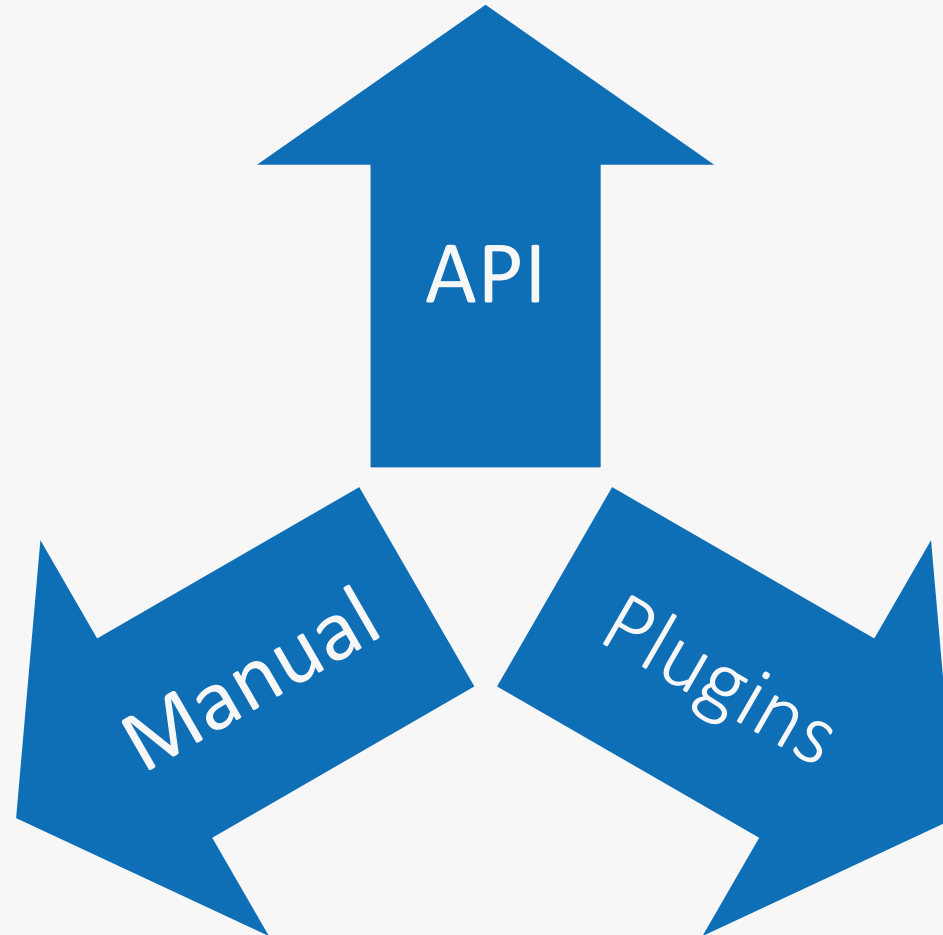
Arachne

IT database developed by the European Commission and used for risk scoring of projects funded by the ESIF. Its primary objective is to support managing authorities in their administrative controls and management checks

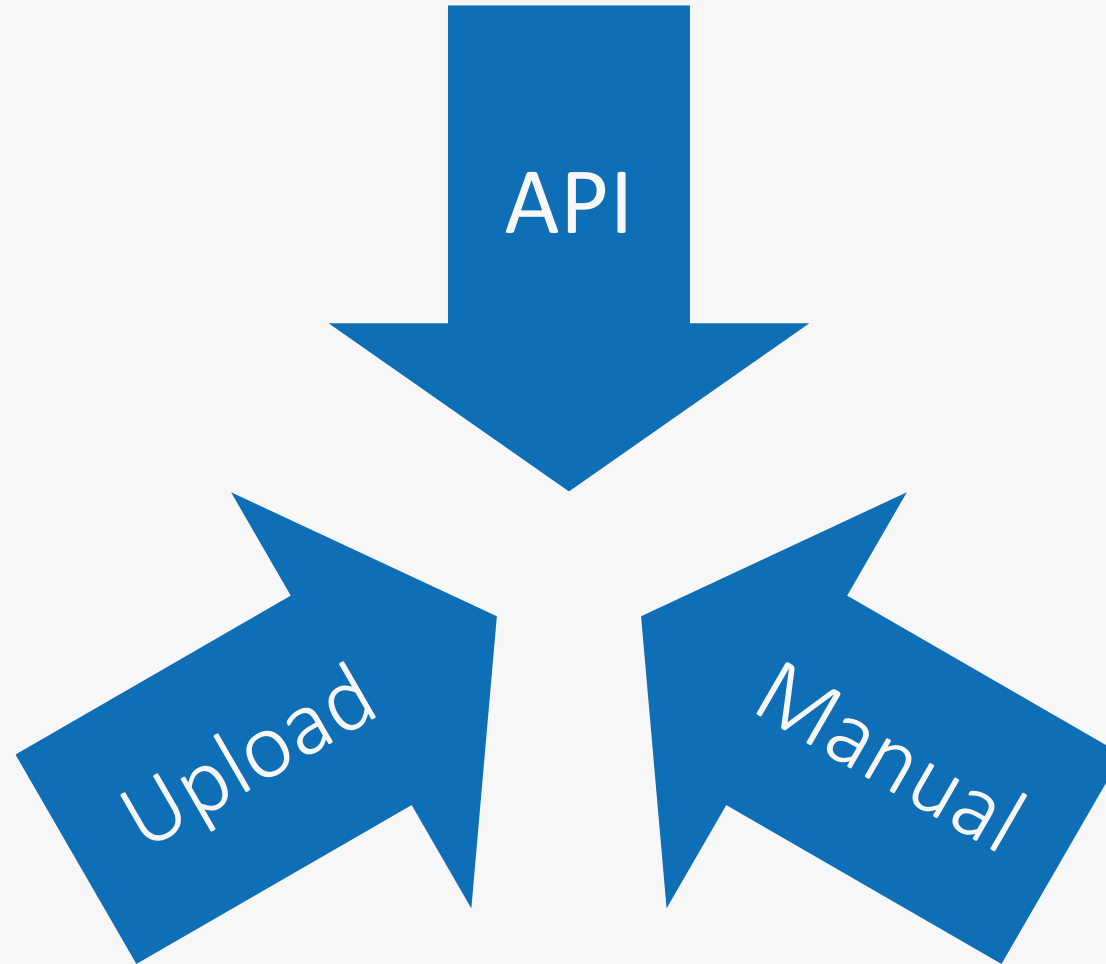
Specific registries

Irregularity Management System (IMS), State aid registries (SARI, TAM, national and EU registries), Early Detection and Exclusion System (EDES), ...

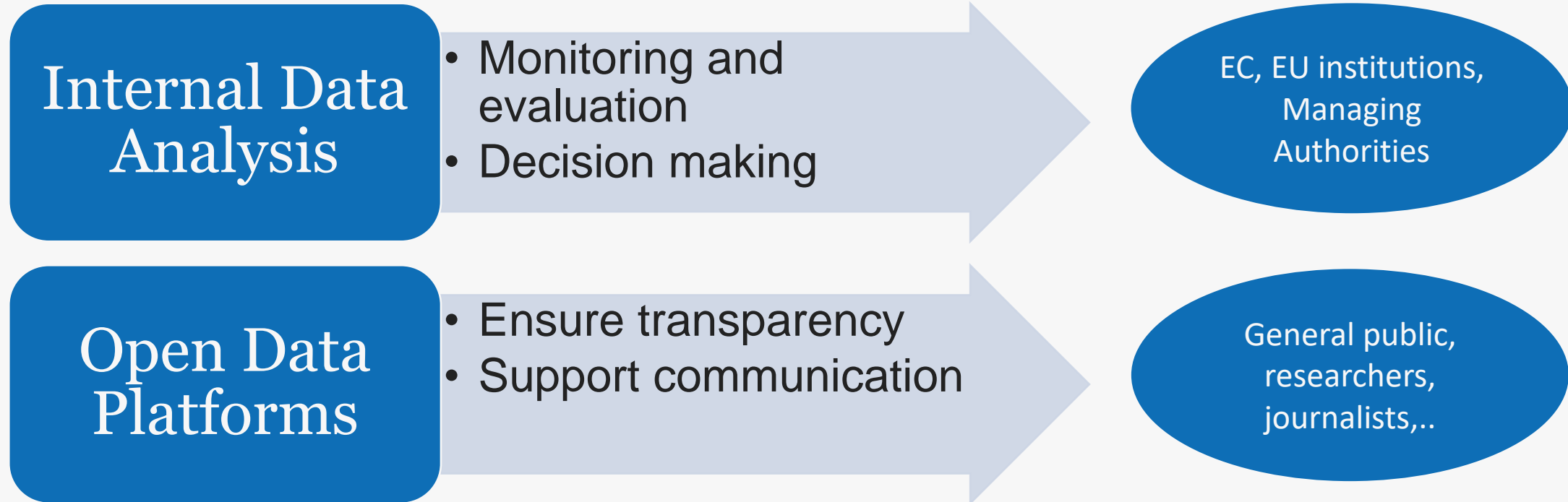

List of operations:

- format, data structure, and granularity of the information vary per programme
- not reported to the EC

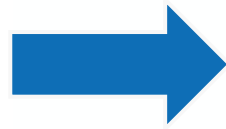
Kohesio

- standardises and aggregates the data from the lists of operations
- makes them publicly available
- <https://kohesio.ec.europa.eu/en/>

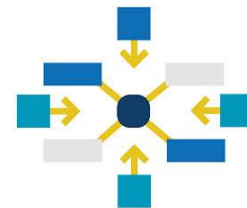
Cohesion Open Data Platform

- provides transparent data to EU taxpayers on the use of EU budget funds
- free public data published by the EC

Keep.eu

- Interreg projects and achievements from 20+ years
- Only curated dataset of Interreg

Interreg.eu

- Telling stories, could be complemented by data
- Informing about open calls

State of Interreg

- Should use data from above platforms
- Benchmarking, helps set an accurate narrative

State of Interreg Report

Two editions so far, 2025 is coming!

Narrative defining

2023 Edition | September

- **4.5 billion** made available in first calls
- **148 calls** (inc. submission rounds) to date
- **43 planned calls** taking place in 2024

2024 Edition | March

- **5.5 billion** already assigned to projects – halfway there!
- Almost **4,000 projects** selected
- **315 million** in ongoing calls
- **70 planned calls** in 2025

Issues in open data platforms

Availability

- Not all programmes submit data
- Ease of finding data varies

Ownership

- Programme have own structure
- Incentive based cooperation

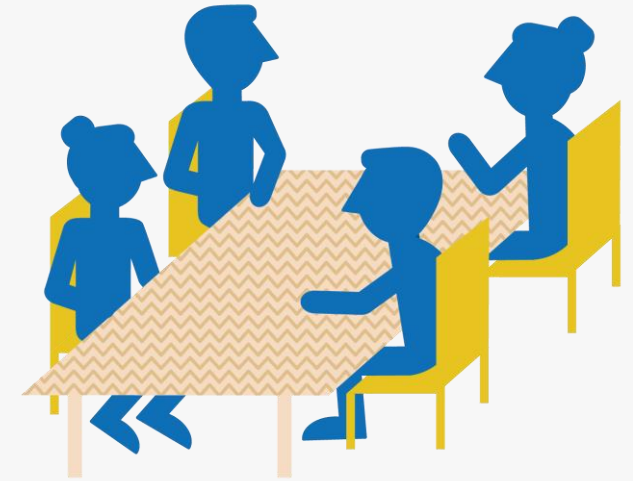
Quality

- Consistency of (required) fields
- Published data not machine-readable

Unique factors

- Third country funding
- Priorities versus PO and SO breakdowns

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Post27 regulation and monitoring systems

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3 Layers of legislation remain

MFF (draft)	Accompanied by political communication
NRP (draft) & ERDF -CF (draft)	Comparable to: 21-27 CPR 21-27 ERDF-Cohesion Fund Regulation
Interreg Plan (not published yet)	Comparable to: General part → Interreg regulation incl. identification of geographic areas and allocation breakdown for each chapter [<i>Article 9(1) ERDF</i>] Chapters → Programmes Interreg Plan is to provide continuity with the existing programmes

Design & Roles **remain**

- Interreg in 4 strands *[Article 7(1) ERDF]*
- partnership requirements *[Article 6 NRP]*
- similar Programme Authorities: MA, JS, AA *[Article 10(1) and (4) ERDF]*, GoA *[Article 10(5) ERDF]*, MC *[Article 10(6) ERDF]*
- *Annual system audit*



Finance structures **remain**

- Total Interreg budget: EUR 10.264 billion [Article 10(2)(c) NRP]
- TA Flat rate: 8% Interreg 10% OMR
- EU co-financing: 80% Interreg 85% OMR



New legislation

Performance framework and budget tracking Regulation

Performance based approach reporting to EC
System audit on milestones and targets, not expenditure
Management verification on milestones and targets, not expenditure

Global Europe

Article 7(2) ERDF, allows for OMR, IPA, NEXT programmes to make use of Global Europe fund

New aspects

Reform dimension	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The combination of reforms and investment will be a key element for the national plans • Reform dimension also important for Interreg, think of contributing to reforms through Interreg projects.
Performance based approach	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Relationship with the Commission to be based on performance • Each Interreg chapter to contain a list and description of measures to be supported, along with milestones and targets <i>[Article 8(3)(c) ERDF]</i> • Total estimated costs of the measures to also be set out <i>[Article 8(3)(d) ERDF]</i>
General and Interreg specific objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 General objectives, 3 ISO • There will no longer be a thematic concentration → Programmes can choose what they want to focus on

New programme financing

Pre-financing

Change of approach – 4% per year for the first three years *[Article 17(2) NRP]*. All pre-financing to be cleared at closure *[Article 17(3) NRP]* (currently 14% over 6 years)

Automatic decommitment

Reduction in timing to n+1 to accelerate the spending *[Article 15(1) NRP]*

However, both needs to be viewed along with performance-based payments – procedural targets will provide additional payments early on if set as milestones

Monitoring systems, IT Tools & Data fields

- A new **SFC2028** will be there, Automatic data transfer responsibility of MS.
- **Single Gateway project** from EU is rather a single portal tool for all funds similar to KOHESIO & Cohesion open data platform (not a monitoring system).
- **Monitoring systems are still required** NRP Article 51 (h), Article 58 (k)
- NRP Article 63 **Data collection and recording** (Less data fields mentioned compared to CPR Annex XVII)
