Enlarging the possibilities to implement best project outputs in the Mediterranean countries

Need to set up a **punctual exchange** to avoid overlaps and maximise the re-use of the best results in different geographical areas of the Mediterranean Sea Basin

MMM Governance

- Light but structured coordination that **respects the governance and operational prerogatives of each** Programme
- Encourages a reinforced **collaboration** and the achievement of **common goals**

MAIN CHALLENGES

To **structure the coordination** with other Programmes and initiatives to gather the **best results** achieved by their projects

To **maximize the impact** of Programmes **in the territories of participating countries** through capitalization experiences

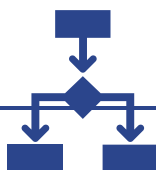
To **promote the synergies** among **different actors** working on the same thematic objectives

- joint evaluations

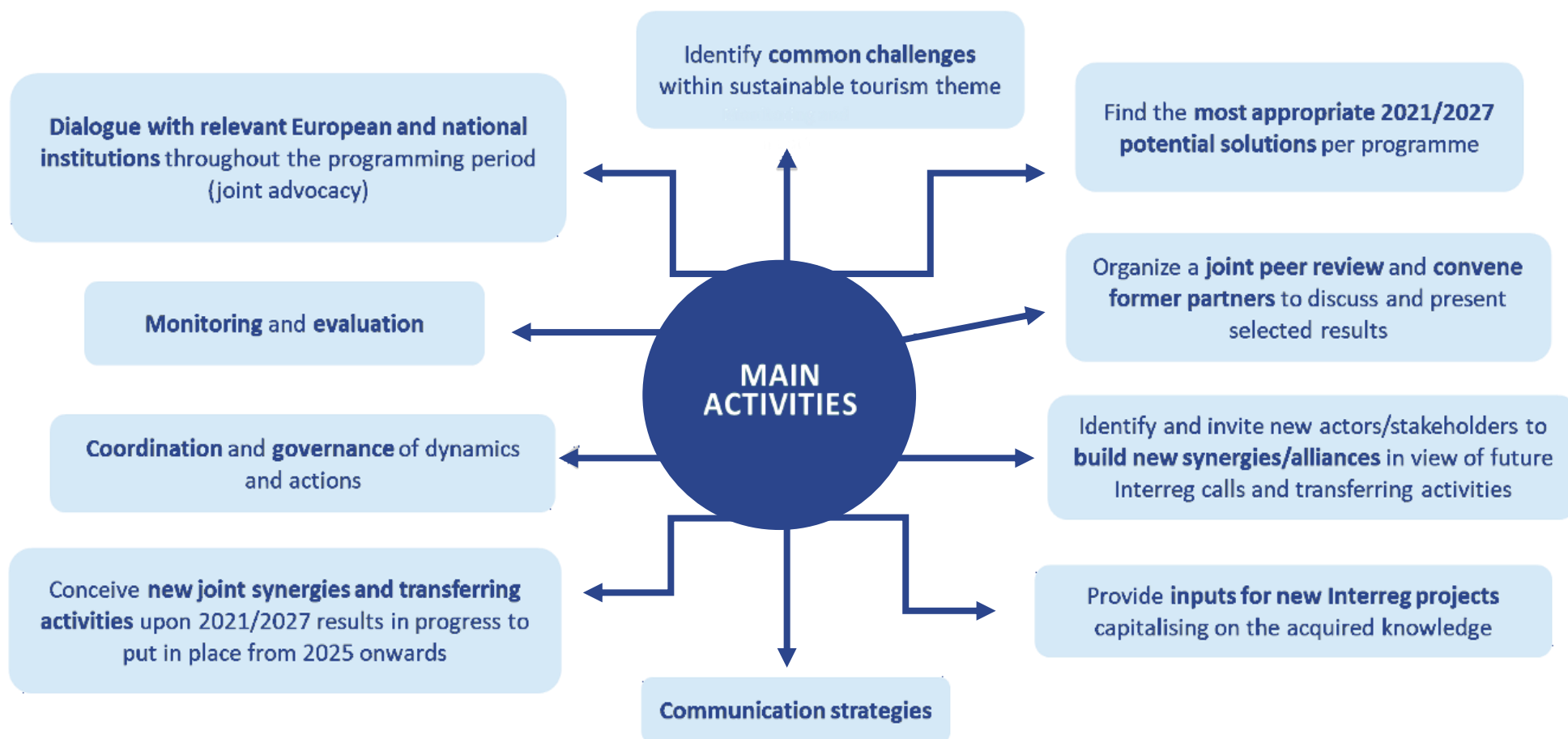

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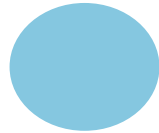
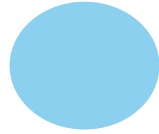
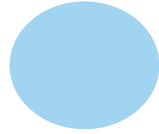
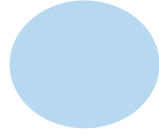
OUTCOMES

- **Mapping of the achieved results of Interreg projects** on Sustainable Tourism in the Mediterranean



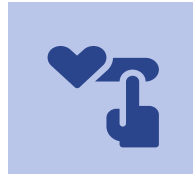

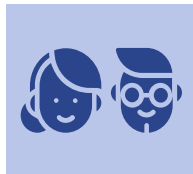

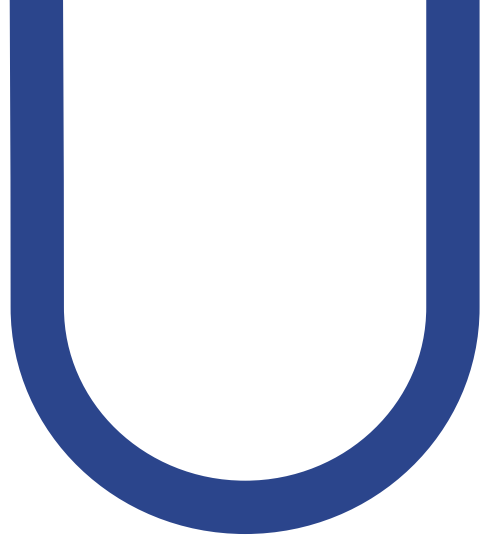
The **hybrid format** was much **appreciated** (77% would like the next major event to follow the same format)
