Outlines

Following the publication of the draft legal package for 2021-2027, Interact will focus the planned Knowledge Fair 2025 on the topic of the MFF. With support from DG REGIO, this two-day event will focus on the future, including what's known, what's unsure and what's not mentioned.

Topics to be covered include the start-up of programmes as well as roles and responsibilities in Post 2027. It will also explore the key changes proposed in July and elaborated in the Webinar on 12 September 2025.

The event objectives below set out how this event can build a better shared understanding, explore the vision of Interreg in the future period, and seek paths ahead to ensure the most effective Interreg yet.

Please note, the agenda below is draft, and may still be updated following further development.

Target audience

The topics for the event will concern the practical application of the proposed rules, as well as reflect on what's missing. Experienced Interreg colleagues who are able to reflect on how the regulations will likely be applied in their programme will be best placed to participate in the Fair.

Objectives

The event shall:

- 1. Build on the shared understanding of the draft proposals
- 2. Bring experienced Interreg experts together to discuss the implementation of the proposals
- 3. Explore some of the key changes, and how Interreg could adapt to them
- 4. Enable wider exchange and networking between programmes
- 5. Help Interact understand where further interventions can add more value for Interreg Post 2027

Programming Post 2027 | Design

This session will focus on the programme design. We invite representatives of Interreg programmes to engage in a discussion around the questions **what, when,** and **who** should start programming, how to plan and conduct the process. We aim also to have first insights at the **intervention logic** and its building blocks and see what **reforms** could mean into the context of Interreg.

Important is to present and have exchange on the regulatory changes and what effects it can impose on Interreg programming. Certain aspects of programming will stay the same therefore we aim to take the stock what is still relevant and build on the previous experience.

Programming Post 2027 | Roles and responsibilities in programme management and implementation

This session will bring together programme representatives to discuss the evolving roles of key programme bodies – MA, MC, JS, NA, Controllers, and AA – in the 2028–2034 period.

The discussion will explore how the new regulatory requirements, including the strengthened partnership principle, will shape programme governance and implementation throughout the lifecycle, from decision-making to management verification, payment, audit, communication and visibility. Building on lessons from previous periods, we will also address key challenges and identify practical ways to enhance coordination, transparency, and efficiency across programme structures and partners.

New waters ahead: strengthening synergies and capitalisation.

Improving synergies and capitalising on results are vital to Interreg's future impact and legacy. Building on earlier reflections, this session will explore how programmes' needs for capitalisation and synergies should be tackled in the future period: systematic integration, clearer requirements, flexible guidance, others?

Interreg Specific Objectives 2 and 3

The session highlights the new ISO3 on strengthening resilience in Eastern border regions, building on Interreg experience and the Eastern Border Pact. It also explores ISO2 on a safer and more secure Europe, reflecting the broader security focus in the MFF proposal. Session also connects to wider concept on resilience.

Exploring the known and unknown financial aspects

We explore both known and unknown aspects in future regulation proposals in terms of finances. We brainstorm what is missing and what Interreg programmes would like to take from current period to the new one.

Interreg visibility, going beyond the regulations

As Interreg looks beyond 2027, consistent communication across programmes is more important than ever. We will examine the current approach, and the implications of the draft regulations, to identify ways to highlight our collective achievements and ensure they resonate with our audiences.

External cooperation

This session explores the future of Interreg external cooperation under the Global Europe umbrella. Discussion will address enlargement prospects, evolving neighbourhood challenges and outermost regions specificities but also the technical implications that the MFF proposal brings.

Territoriality and ISO1

The new regulation is out and Interreg found its place in the Interreg plan. In this session, we'll explore together what has changed, what remains unclear, and how territorial impact can be guaranteed through instruments such as ISO1 in a post27 era.

Data 'beastie' or bestie' in Post 2027

After exploring the new requirements as they are understood, this session will zoom out and explore how open data approaches can strengthen programme implementation.

Soft skills in Interreg

Cooperation succeeds because of people. Interreg professionals thrive through both technical expertise and soft skills. These build trust, enable adaptability, and form the foundation of effective cooperation. Join us to explore and define the skills essential for successful Interreg implementation.

Travel

The Dubrovnik Ruđer Bošković Airport, also referred to as Čilipi Airport Dubrovnik is the nearest airport. It is approximately 20 km from the venue and has connections from major hub airports.

Other travel options to Dubrovnik are limited, due to its seasonal nature. The agenda has designed to offer best value for a full-day of travel to arrive, and a full-day to return home.

Accommodation
