- Number of awarded projects: appr. 150






Sole beneficiary principle

Final recipient/beneficiary

- Applications shall be submitted independently by the Final Beneficiary responsible for organizing the event.
- The final beneficiary is responsible for submitting the application, organizing the planned event, and accounting for the project's finances.
- Cross border partner is responsible to deliver citizens the guests for the event from the other side of the border

Interreg specific activities

ISP 1 | Building partnerships

The applicant must ensure that the organizations involved in the partnership introduce themselves to each other and present their activities and achievements (e.g., in the form of a formal board meeting, presentation, information materials, information stand, exhibition, film, etc.).

ISP2 | Getting to know each other's cultural values

The applicant must ensure that the diversity and cultural values of the host country are presented, e.g. by showcasing local attractions, sights, joint visits to natural attractions, presentations of local handicrafts and gastronomy, exhibitions of works of art, performances by local traditional or contemporary art groups.

ISP 3 | Promoting the democratic values of the European Union

The final beneficiary must ensure that citizens living in the border region have the opportunity to engage in open discussions in order to learn about the benefits of European identity and solidarity and to express what kind of Europe they would like to see (e.g. through thematic forums, roundtable discussions, Europe-Sole beneficiary principle



Project creation

- Submitted projects goes through quality assessment
- 2 new projects are created by EGTCs
- All selected projects are re-uploaded into one common project
- Common projects last for 1 year





Implementation/Reporting

- Events are usually organized between April –
 October time
- Reporting starts after the event is organized
- Report consists of
 - Attendance sheet for ISP1
 - Proof of using mandatory communication measures (Molino, roll-up)
 - Comprehensive photo documentation
 - Final report textual report
- Risk-based verification (1st five projects are controlled)
