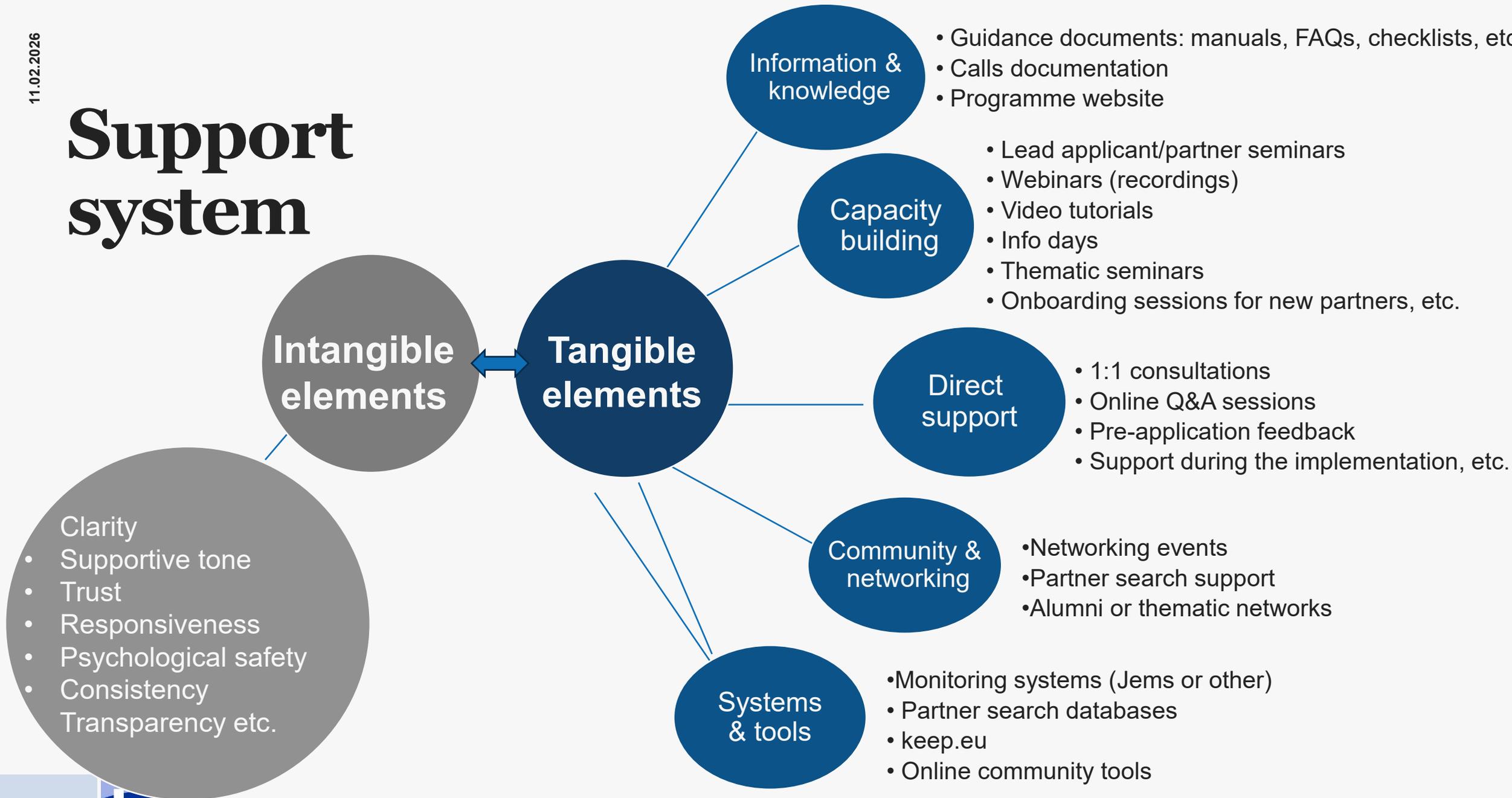

From knowledge to behaviour change

Information- knowledge gap

Having the **right amount of information at the right time**

Skills

Something is accomplished when the **learner uses the information**

Can learner use it just hearing once during the event or reading in guidance document?

Motivation

People are rarely unwilling Instead having **competing priorities, overwhelmed, distracted**, not understanding **why** it is important, etc.

Behaviour change

We can either lower or raise the effort required to act by design of our support system.

We cannot control individual choice but we can influence behaviour through designing support systems.

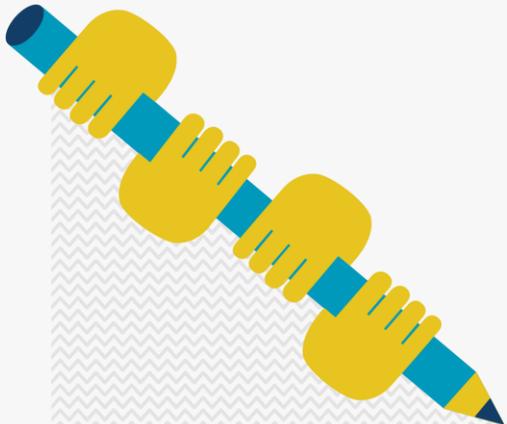

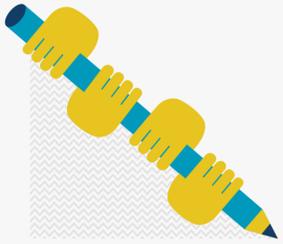

Brain friendly learning: challenges and opportunities

- Cognitive load theory  keep it short and simple
- Forgetting curve  help to remember
- Attention span  capture and retain attention
- Emotions and environm.  motivate and establish trust

how we design support to work with brain
not against it

Cognitive load theory



Less is more
Simpler support



Some efforts are unavoidable (rules are complex)



Some efforts help learning (practising discussing, applying)

- **reduce extra**
- **accept complexity**
- **focus on what helps**

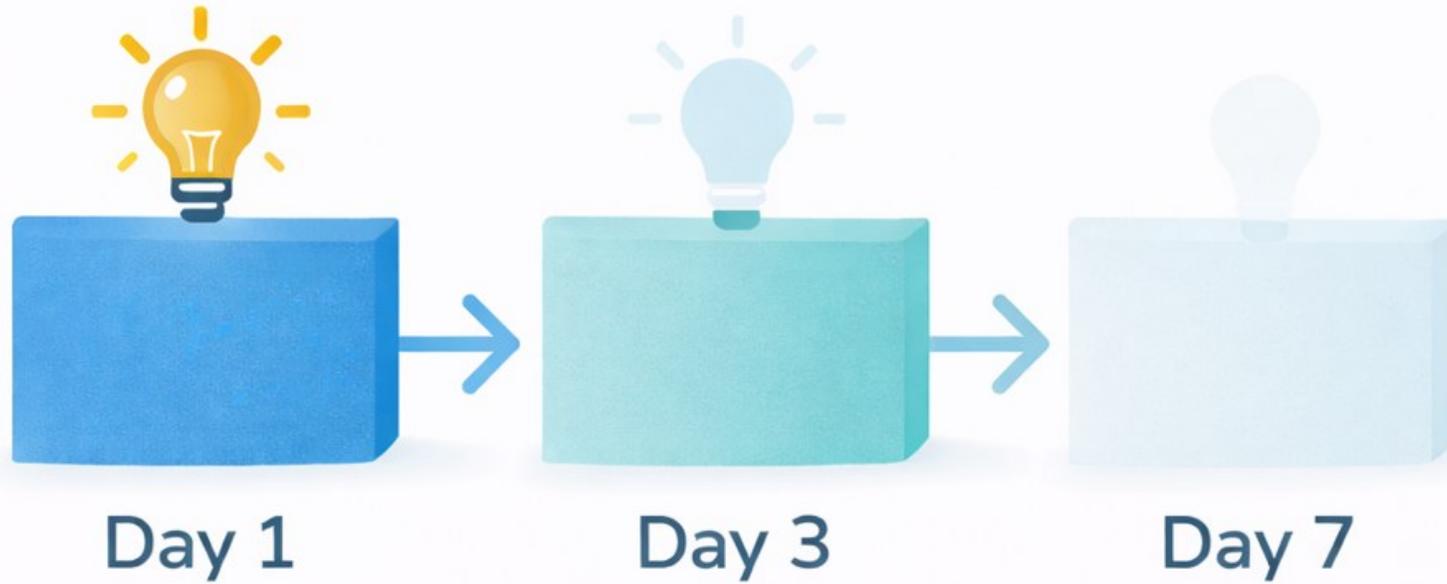
Ebbinghaus's Forgetting Curve

We forget up to **70–80%** of new information within a week without practice and any other additional measures to increase retention



We forget most information quickly

Without use or practice





Attention is limited



Drops after 10–15 min in person



Even sooner online



Emotions and environment



Safety and connection

→ Improve learning



Stress

→ reduce learning

Implication 1

Cognitive load

Less is more

Right information at the right time

Chuncking

For example, presentation: per slide max 3-5 points, not more than 30-40 words, new concepts per session 5-7 max (4?), repeat key ideas, design the practice and application etc.

Implication 2

Forgetting curve

Learning journey
to help to
remember

- **Spacing:** pre event material, event, follow up meeting, reminder before the reporting, short recap after longer period
- **Repetition:** recap slides, quizzes, reminder emails, checklists, key messages
- **Practice** converts knowledge into skills: analyse an example, simulate a real task, provide a problem solving case (**use it or lose it**)

Implication 3

Attention

Designing for
attention

- Help to connect and recognise that distractions are normal
- Interaction helps to reset the focus (various methods, break out rooms online)
- No tech in the room for in person
- Physical movements, game elements, energisers, etc.

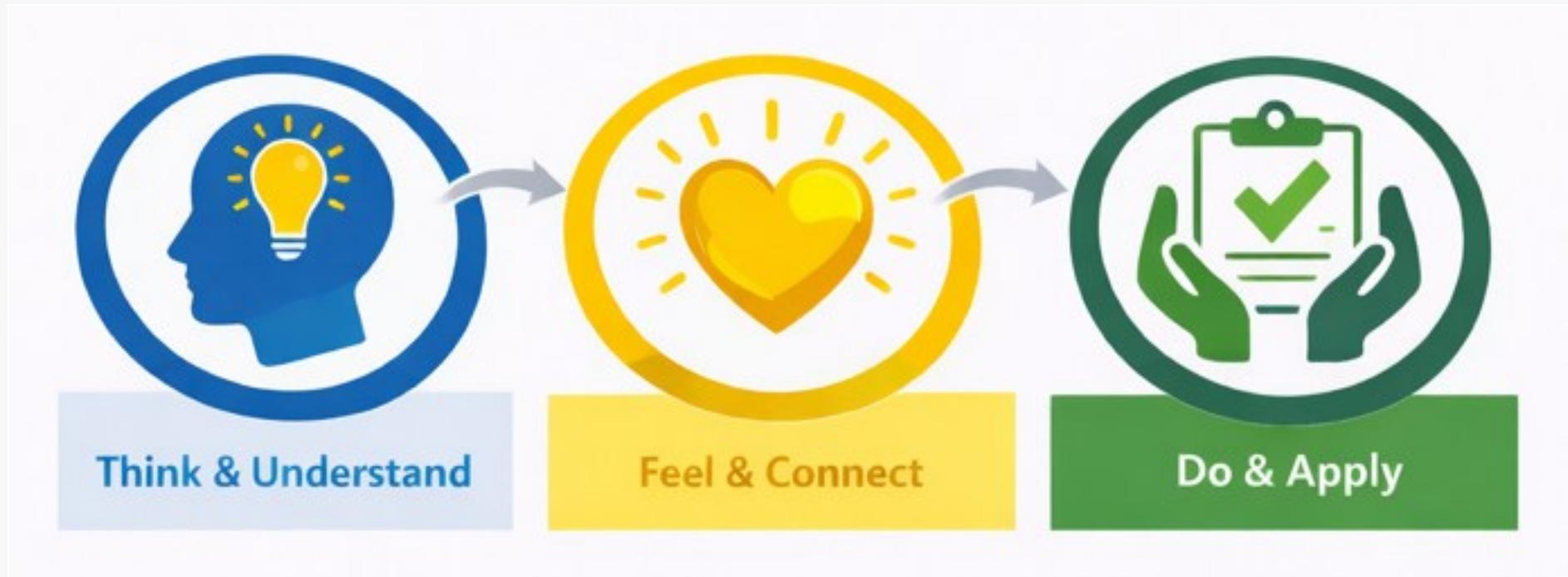

Interreg programme and project managers, including those with content and finance roles.

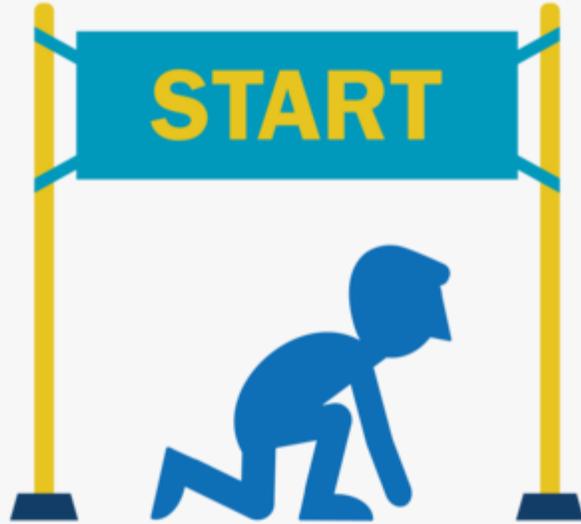

This event is designed for programme staff who are new to Interreg, and who want to learn about Interact's tools, services and learning opportunities.

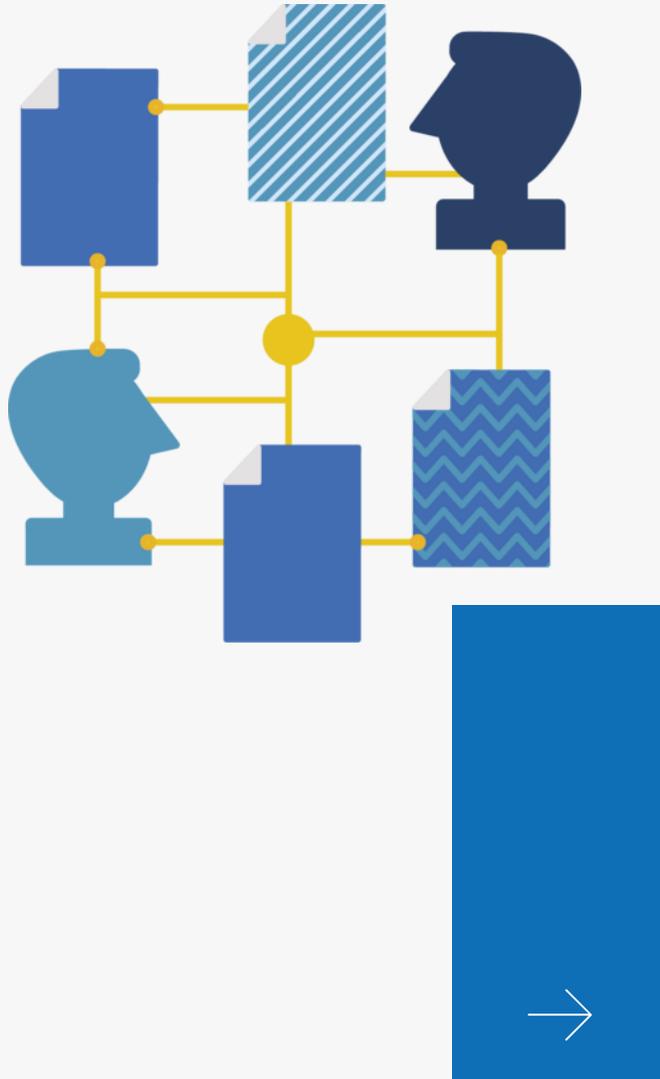
