



Venue and practical information

The venue



Belgrade – How to?

Official currency: Serbian dinar (RSD)

Exchange rate:

1 EUR=116-117 RSD

Card payment widely acceptable

Cash machines at the arrival area at the airport

Moving around the city:

- Public transport is free
- Always use **official taxis**
- App order service is available

Tips

- Bring your passports!
- Automatic passport machines available for the majority of the EU passports
- There is no Roaming arrangement with EU so make sure to switch off your data
- Many SIM card options available for purchase at the baggage area.

Getting to Belgrade

By plane (Belgrade Nikola Tesla Airport)

From the airport to the city center:

Airport shuttle minibus A1

Connection to city centre: Square Slavija

🕒 25–30 min | (cash only)

Public transport buses (free of charge)

No. 72 to the stop: Zeleni Venac (city centre)

Brankov most (close to the venue)

No. 72N for the night arrivals: stop Republic square

Taxi to the city centre

Use only official taxis with official voucher system!

E-kiosk locations for the voucher:

Three e-kiosks in the baggage claim area

Taxis are just outside of the arrival area.

In majority of cases can be paid by the card, however cash payment is recommended.

Fixed prices:

Zone 1: 2700 RSD (to the venue) approx.: 25 EUR

Zone 2: 3500 RSD (to the city centre) approx.: 30 EUR

Getting to Belgrade

By train (Beograd Centar – Prokop)

There are multiple options to the city centre from the train station. Let us know and we will advise you

By car

Venue easily accessible via E75 highway

Paid parking available at venue and nearby (Ušće shopping centre)

Getting to venue

- Multiple options with public transport or taxi for relatively low price
- Public buses
- Trams
- Precise information will be included in the practical details

Suggested hotels



Walking distance 5–10 min


IN Hotel Belgrade
