



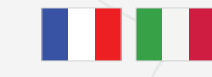
Adrinclusive

Fosters innovative and sustainable tourism in the Adriatic region, tailored for individuals with dementia and cognitive decline. By bridging tourism and welfare sectors, the project develops inclusive travel experiences, pilots cross-border vacation models, and promotes a replicable strategy for accessible tourism. Through joint actions and digital tools, ADRINCLUSIVE aims to build a resilient, socially inclusive tourism network across Italy and Croatia.



Paysage Plus Aimable

This is a cross-border initiative between France and Italy aimed at enhancing and preserving shared landscape. The project promotes sustainable land management, biodiversity protection and ecological connectivity while integrating cultural and social values. It also encourages community involvement and cross-border cooperation to create more livable and resilient territories.



RivierALP Cycling Routes and Walking Path

It focuses on sustainable management of cross-border river ecosystems between France and Italy. It aims at improving flood prevention, restore ecological continuity and enhance water quality while supporting biodiversity. This project also fosters cooperation between local authorities and communities to create safer river landscapes.



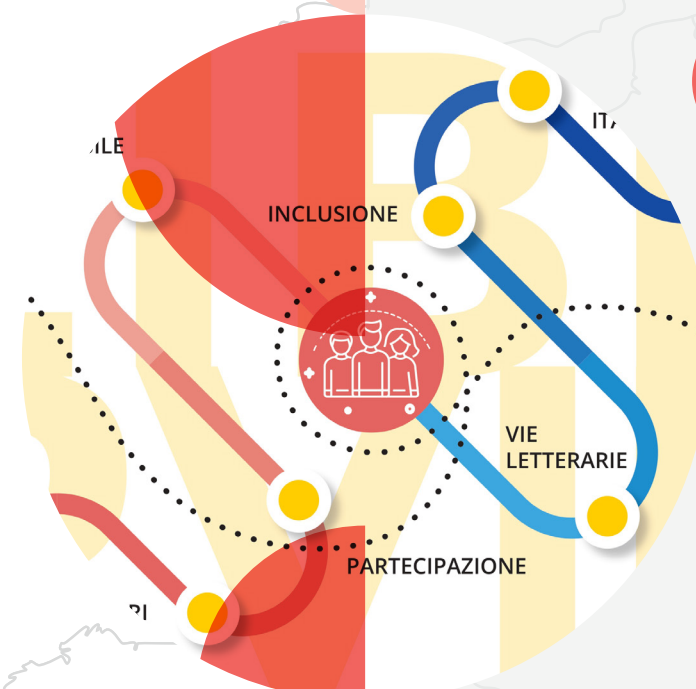
ATTRA(c)TIVE - Terres Monviso

This project promotes the Monviso cross-border territory as a sustainable tourism destination. It enhances cultural and natural heritage, develops eco-friendly tourism services and supports local businesses. The initiative strengthens cross-border cooperation to make the area more appealing, accessible and competitive in international tourism.



APICI

APICI opens the mountains to everyone, promoting inclusive and sustainable outdoor tourism in Val Masino and Val Bregaglia. Accessible trails, a bouldering park for all abilities, and Forest Therapy routes offer a unique blend of nature, sport, and well-being. Digital tools and multilingual signage make planning easy and immersive for visitors of all abilities. A cross-border vision shaping an international hub for accessible climbing and outdoor adventure.



LIBERVIE - Freedom to Move

LIBERVIE is a cross-border initiative that opens cultural and literary heritage to everyone. It creates inclusive and accessible routes through the Verbano-Cusio-Ossola and Ticino regions, inviting people of all abilities to explore and connect. Through digital innovation, tactile museum experiences, and multimedia cycling paths, LIBERVIE redefines tourism as a shared, barrier-free journey. LIBERVIE is a new way to travel—inclusive, interactive, and inspired by local stories.



IN3VIE

IN3VIE is a cross-border project that builds a network of accessible tourist destinations across Valais, Aosta Valley, and Piedmont. It promotes a cultural shift toward inclusive tourism by improving infrastructure and raising awareness among professionals and the public. The project empowers travelers with disabilities as valued guests, not just recipients of assistance. Through training, tactile maps, sign language videos, and inclusive guides, IN3VIE enhances autonomy and emotional connection. It fosters social inclusion, economic growth, and a new vision of barrier-free travel.



CAST: Culture trAnSforming communiTies and economies

The CAST project promotes social inclusion by rethinking culture as an active resource for innovation and cohesion. Building on existing knowledge, it reframes culture from static heritage to a dynamic foundation for resilient, thriving communities, supporting the EU's just and green transition.



Access Routes

The project will expand accessible nature tourism in Latvia and Estonia by creating 30 routes for people with disabilities, seniors, families, and others. It will add attractions, services, trails, and heritage sites to mapeiros.eu, focusing on underrepresented regions. Creative tactile solutions will be installed at 12 sites in Latvia and 9 in South Estonia, and a unified 'Disability Friendly' quality standard and brand will be established.



Accessible Hiking Trails

The project will make Latvia's and Estonia's Forest and Coastal Trails more inclusive for seniors, families, wheelchair users, youth, and culturally or linguistically diverse groups. It will improve accessibility at 16 sites, upgrade signage, train service providers, and promote accessible hiking. The goal is to expand participation and strengthen cross-border tourism through accessibility.



Green Railways II

The project will enhance the Green Railways cross-border tourism product in Estonia and Latvia by upgrading existing routes, linking new attractions, and improving accessibility for families, seniors, and people with disabilities. It includes seven pilot investments, joint solutions for trail design and services, and improved information tools. The aim is to raise service quality, share best practices, boost rural tourism competitiveness, and strengthen cross-border cooperation.



Tourism for All - HERMES II

The project is a joint effort to improve accessibility for people with mobility problems. It combines insights from the Cyprus Paraplegic Association with challenges identified by the Municipalities of Paralimni and Syros-Ermoupolis. The goal is to promote accessible tourism for all with mobility issues, including the elderly, pregnant, or temporarily injured, not just people with disabilities.



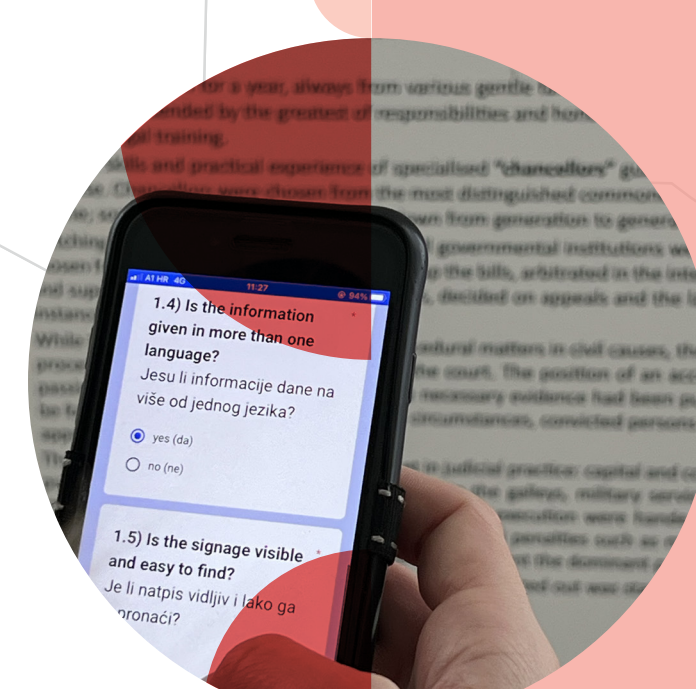
In - Heritage: Accessible Nature and Culture

The Municipality of Rethymno with the National Confederation of Disabled People Greece (NCDP) in Greece and the Municipality of Ayia Napa and the Municipality of Sotira in Cyprus is the partnership scheme of the project, which focuses on improving accessibility to natural and cultural sites, highlighting and promoting them as well as developing common strategies and tools with the aim to develop 'tourism for all'.



IBC

The IBC (Inclusive Border Cycling) project aims to promote social inclusion and sustainable tourism by enhancing and integrating cultural and natural heritage along cycling routes in disadvantaged, remote border areas of the Danube region. Specifically, it addresses challenges such as demographic issues, social vulnerability, and infrastructure gaps that affect these areas.



SITE: Shaping Inclusive Tourist Experiences

The SITE (Shaping Inclusive Tourist Experiences) project promotes inclusive tourism by applying Universal Design principles to reduce physical and digital access barriers. Through cross-border cooperation, it develops strategies, tools, and pilot actions to improve accessibility in public spaces, transport hubs, and cultural sites in Italy and Croatia, enhancing tourism for all.



Virtualand

The VIRTUALAND project aims to identify, protect, and promote the unique cultural heritage of the Greece-Albania cross-border area by transforming rare and fragile library assets into immersive virtual reality (VR) experiences. By creating an interactive VR platform and a library of 3D objects, the project enables tourists to engage deeply with the region's tangible and intangible heritage, even when original materials are inaccessible.
